
Info session 10/11: STW's Student Service trips!

Updated PSAT information 9/21:

The PSAT is Coming to Needham High!

For 11th and 10th graders:

-The PSAT will be offered at Needham High School on **Saturday, October 14t**h. The test starts at 8:00 am, with student entry/check-in from 7:30-8:00am.

-For juniors, the results are used for National Merit (NMSQT) Scholarship eligibility (non-juniors are not considered for NMSQT eligibility).

-Payment and registration through MySchoolBucks.

-Cost \$34

-Registration is open in MySchoolBucks from Sept 5th - October 1st. -For any issues paying through MySchoolBucks or requests for Fee Waivers, please see Mr. Grannan in the Counseling Office or email <u>will_grannan@needham.k12.ma.us</u>.

-If testing with a Fee Waiver you do not register through MySchoolBucks. Mr Grannan will register you manually after you contact him with the Fee Waiver request.

-The PSAT this year is DIGITAL. Learn more about the NEW Digital PSAT from the College Board @ <u>https://satsuite.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt/</u> preparing.

-Students may use personal computers or school issued Chromebooks to take the PSAT. PSAT uses the Bluebook application for the exam. Students with school issued Chromebooks should already see it in their list of applications. To download Bluebook on your own device, go to this <u>Bluebook link</u>. DOWNLOAD AND LOGIN TO THE BLUEBOOK APP NOW. Make sure you can login and navigate the application (can also be used for test prep.)

-To test with accommodations, students must have official approval from the CollegeBoard. You can contact Mr. Grannan if you have any questions regarding CollegeBoard approved accommodations. If approved, the accommodations will be built into the digital administration on test day.





AN IMPORTANT REMINDER FROM NHS NURSES

SNAP Parent Portal for Health Services

We ask Needham Families to update your child's medical information each year in the Alerts and Conditions Tab and to give permission for Over-The-Counter Medication in the Medication Tab. This current information is important for nurses to be able to best care for your child. This update in SNAP is taking the place of the nurse form in PowerSchool.

The SNAP Health Parent Portal is an online platform that gives you direct access to your student's school health record, permissions, and direct communication with nurses.

You can use the SNAP Health Portal to:

- Give permission for your child to have Over-the-counter medications during this school year including Tylenol/Acetaminophen, Motrin/ibuprofen, bacitracin, Caladryl, Cough drops [8 years and up], Hydrocortisone, and Antacid/TUMS. This permission must be given each school year.
- Inform the nurses of medical conditions, alerts, and medication
- Send secure messages directly to the nurses
- Upload a copy of your child's physical exam forms, orders, or documents
- Access Needham Public School medical forms

Parents/Guardians receive an email from SNAP Parent Portal (from:

noreply@studentehr.com) with login instructions including a username and password. Once registered, see instructions below.

- SNAP Health Parent Portal Log in: Click <u>www.studentehr.com</u> to log into the SNAP Health Parent Portal.
 - If you forget your password, please click "Forgot Password?" under the password box to reset.
 - IMPORTANT: Email notifications sent from the Nursing Department via the SNAP Health Portal will come from the email address noreply@studentehr.com.

Another way to access the SNAP Parent Portal: Log on through your parent <u>PowerSchool Account</u> and choose the SNAP/PSNI button in the upper right corner of your parent PowerSchool Ac

You may navigate through the following sections which are found on the left side of the SNAP dashboard. Instructions for each of the Health Record Left Sided Tabs are as follows:

Demographics/Contacts Tab:

• Demographic updates need to be done in the PowerSchool platform

Alerts and Conditions Tab:

- Check that any listed conditions are correct, if they are not, you can make the changes for nurses to review.
- Please add any current medications that your child is currently taking in the "medications: current" tab.
- Please add any new conditions under the "Parent Reported" tab. Written
 - **documentation from your healthcare provider is required** in order for the nurse to confirm the new health condition.
 - Click "Attach Documentation" and upload documents as a pdf or jpeg.
- Check current health information. If the information is correct, simply press the
- CONFIRM button at the top of the screen.

Medications Tab:

- Using the "Orders" button in the top right corner, you may attach any prescribed medication doctor order(s) from your child's doctor and any medication parental consent form(s) which are required for the school nurse to give medication to your child.
- Please use the OTCs button in the upper right hand corner to confirm which over the counter medication your child may have during this school year. Please click on EACH medication to opt your child in or out.

Charts:

• If your child requires any monitoring of blood glucose, peak flow, or blood pressure, this is where you will find charts documenting these values.

Screenings:

- Using the "Upload Proof of Physical" tab in the upper right hand corner: Upload
- physical exam. You can also attach any documentation from a health care provider
 - regarding a screening referral.

Letters:

• This tab also allows your school nurse to attach forms which you can then read and if applicable, sign and send back to your school nurse.

Messages:

- This allows you to contact the school nurse at any time during the school year and
- will alert the school nurse with any messages you send. You can also attach or
 - upload any other information that you would like to have in your child's health record when you create a new message.

Forms:

- You can access Needham Public School forms here: Plans for: Allergy, Asthma,
 - Diabetes, and Seizures, parent permission forms for medication, and Doctor's permission forms.

The Coding School is offering two, no cost two-semester courses in Artificial Intelligence and Quantum Computing for high school students.
