Letter From the Nurses to 9th Grade Families

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Every year the Needham Public School Nurses begin mandated health screenings. Starting in December 2023, the high school will start SBIRT Screenings and in January 2024, will hold Postural Screenings.

In compliance with legislation that was enacted in March of 2016 entitled, An Act Relative to Substance Use, Treatment, Education and Prevention. Part of this law requires that Massachusetts school districts implement an annual verbal substance use screening tool for two different grade levels, one at the middle school level, and one at the high school level.

This law was ordered to help prevent students from starting to use substances, or intervene with early use. Needham Public Schools will be conducting this interview-based screening known as SBIRT Screening for grade 9 students in December of the 2023 school year. This assessment called SBIRT (Screening Brief Intervention Referral to Treatment) will be using the CRAFFT II Screening Tool which is the most utilized tool for adolescents in Massachusetts. SBIRT focuses on early detection, risk assessment, a brief interview and referral to treatment if needed. Each screening will take approximately 5 minutes and will be conducted confidentially by members of our trained SBIRT team in private one-on-one sessions; the SBIRT team will include school nurses, guidance counselors, and members of the Needham Public Health Department. The SBIRT Screening will take place during the students Study/Seminar block on the screening days. Students who are not using substances will have their healthy choices reinforced by the screener. The screener will provide brief feedback to any student who reports using substances and if needed, will refer students to our counseling staff for follow up with written permission from the student. This screening focuses on education and substance use prevention and will not result in disciplinary action. In addition, the results of the screening will NOT be included in your student's school record.

Also, in January we will hold Postural Screening which is Massachusetts mandated. Postural Screening entails observing the alignment and visual assessment for symmetry and anatomic landmarks. Students should wear a tank top or form fitting t-shirt for the assessment. This screening will take place during a Wellness in class unit, and takes 15 seconds.
